- music, sound production
- screen and interactive digital media
- graphic design, screen and interactive digital media
- visual arts practice in painting, drawing, ceramics, glass, photography, wood, printmaking, textiles or jewellery.

A range of courses are available across the state, and are delivered by industry practitioners in professional studio and workplace environments.
